- Participated in team games, developing simple tactics for attacking and defending.




Vocabulary

Sticky Knowledge

Intercepting is when a player from the **defending** team stops a **pass** being made to a member of the **attacking** team by **catching** the ball before it reaches their player.



Intercepting is one of the few ways **defenders** can gain **possession** of the ball.



To succeed at TAG rugby, players need to **attack space** and not to run directly at the **defenders**. This reinforces the most important principle of **attacking play** – go forward.
